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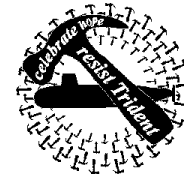
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Arrest: make sure you've been noticed by a legal observer. Give names of anyone arrested to legal support.

At the police station:

- ▷ You must give a *verifiable* name & address before you are released. You do not have to give a date of birth if over 17 (but they'll ask for it).
- ▷ You can have a friend informed: ask them to contact legal support (see front).
- ▷ You can consult a solicitor, free of charge (you can change your mind if you say "no" at first).
- ▷ Overseas citizens can communicate at any time with your High Commission, Embassy or Consulate (for many countries, they may be notified automatically). You can ask for an interpreter before interview.
- ▷ If you want to see a doctor or need medication, tell the police immediately.
- ▷ You are entitled to read the 'PACE' Codes of Practice detailing your rights. You are entitled to keep writing materials in the cell.
- ▷ You can be finger-printed & a DNA sample taken for most offences (even if you're not charged). You can be photographed. Force can be used if you resist, but you do *not* have to sign any *consent* forms.
- ▷ You DO have a right of silence. If in doubt, talk about the issues, not the action. Please do not talk about or mention other people. You may be invited for an 'informal chat' with a police intelligence team, a formal interview is unlikely.

On release: please tell legal support as soon as you're out, and what's happened.

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
